Pursuant to an Order of the County Court of Loudoun to us directed We the Subscribers being first duly Qualified for that Purpose Have viewed the way to turn the road leading from Union to Pumpkin Town to turn out of the same near Sarah Humphreys' small field & fall into the old road before it comes to Jacob Humphreys' Black Smiths Shop & we have also viewed the old road & do report as follows that By turning out of the old road at the End of the Lane on the Line between Sarah Humphrey & John Wilkison & thence a strait course to a small White Oak near the corner of Sarah Humphreys' Corn Field thence near a strait course ^{thru} the said Corn field & a small piece of Wood to the Line between Abel Palmer & S^r Sarah Humphrey to the old road ^{thru with the same} near the Black Smiths Shop, a road can be made on ground equally as good as the old road except where it passes a Drain which will require a small Causeway the difference in the distance is about thirty one & a half Poles more on the proposed change than the old road. We consider that if the change is made the Publick will sustain but little injury & the S^r Sarah Humphrey ^{be} very materially benefited it saving to her a Line of Fence of one Hundred & twenty ~~two~~ Poles in Length, We do require Her to open the said road & make the said Causeway, & put them in good order before the old road is stopped - it is to be understood that the above named Abel Palmer hath given his consent to the road being turned in his Line as above.
