

Pursuant to an Order from the County Court of Loudoun the
undersigned Being first sworn Base View, the Ground along which
said road is proposed to be conducted and do Report that said
alteration start from the road leading from Smiths Mills to Union
River at the point where said Standley's Lane crosses I road
on the North Side of his farm thence S.W. until it strikes
the line between said Standley & John W. Batcher about five rods
South of the corner thence on the line between Standley & Batcher
about a South Course to Standley & Batcher corner thence S.E.
along an old road into the S. ^{Union} ~~South~~ ~~of~~ ~~the~~ ~~road~~ and
inasmuch as I road passes its whole route entirely on the line between
S. Standley & Batcher there can no inconvenience result from
the alteration to any individual: as it respects the convenience
that shall result to David Standley it shows a piece of land which
is now detached from his farm into a convenient tract. As it respects
the Public, the road will be made about thirty rods longer than
it now is by I alteration the ground for a new road being
about as good as the present road. Witness Our hands this 7th
day Sept. 1840.
